 we have a few days to be vigilant. Review your personal emergency plans and locate your town Re-Entry Pass and monitor our media sites for
 future details.
- Our town departments are prepared and ready to respond as the situation requires.
- We will be under a RED FLAG warnings for the next several days for swimmers and surfers on our beaches and strongly advise against going
 into the water as conditions for strong rip tides will be forming.
